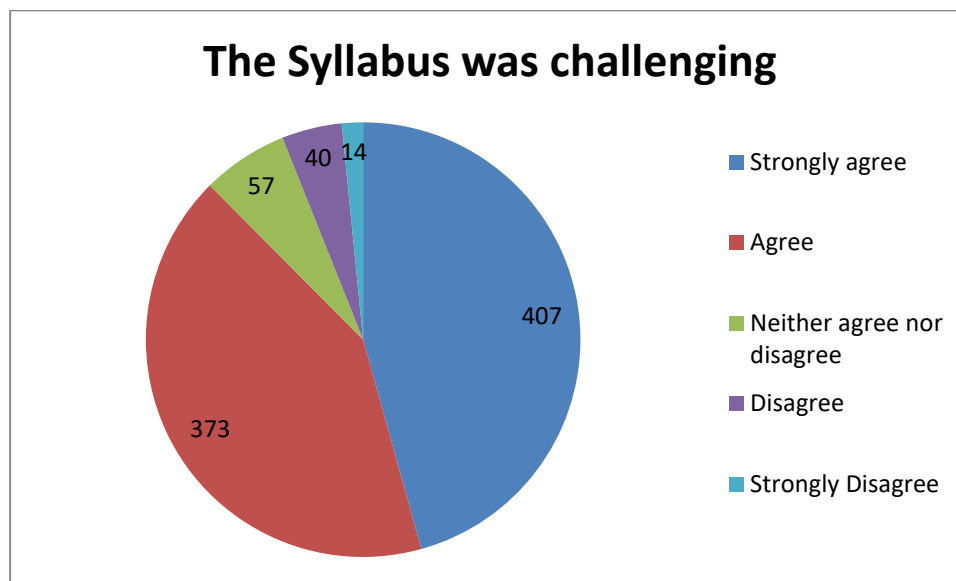
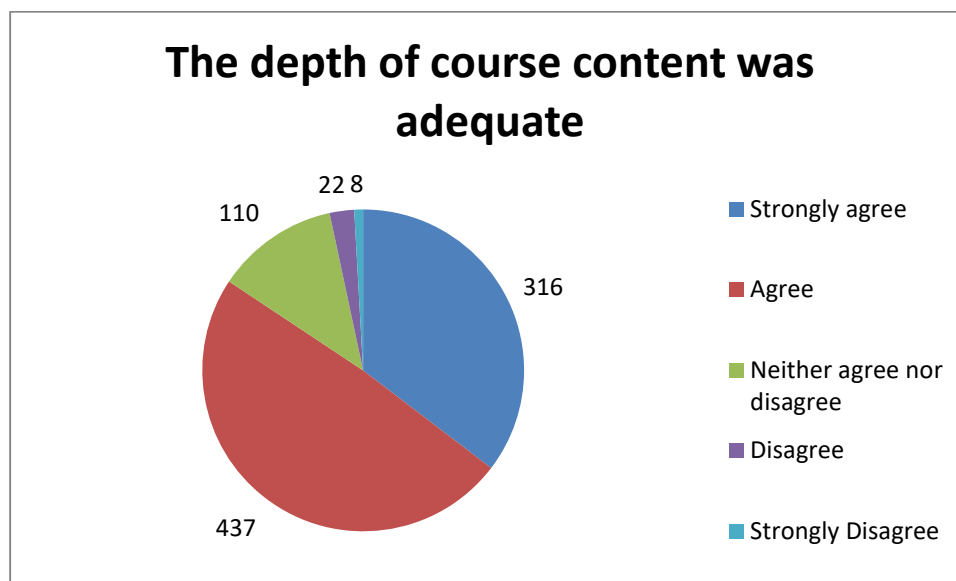

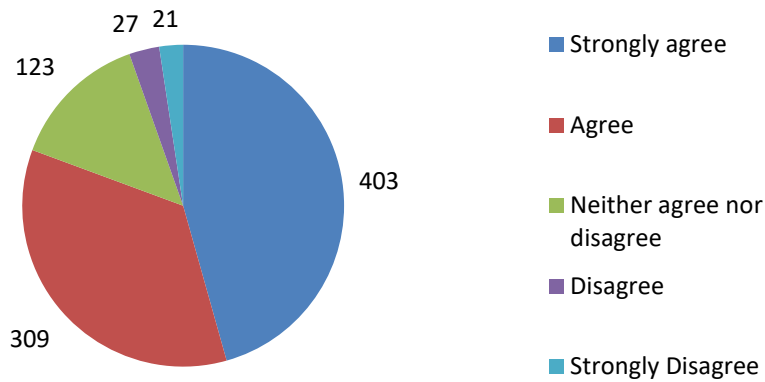


407 students among 891 students strongly agreed that the syllabus was challenging and 373 agreed to the statement. Remaining 111 students disagreed that the syllabus was challenging.



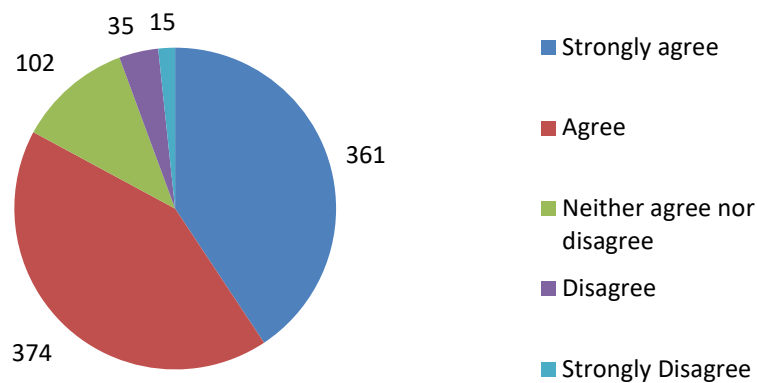
316 students among 893 students strongly agreed and 437 agreed that the depth of the course content was adequate. Remaining 140 students disagreed that the depth of the course content was adequate.

### The Syllabus was relevant to the present day need



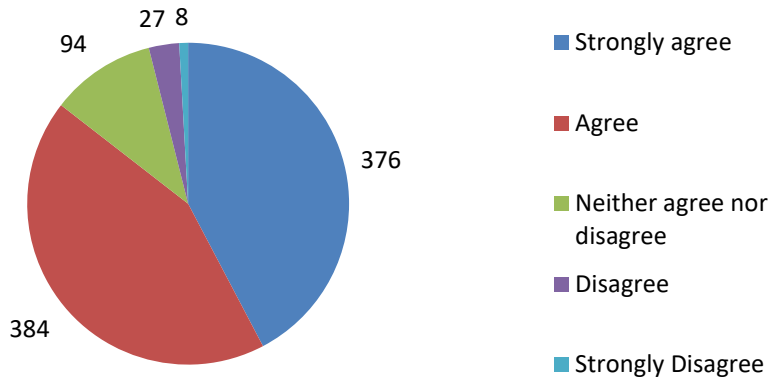

### The syllabus was helpful in attaining the programme specific outcome



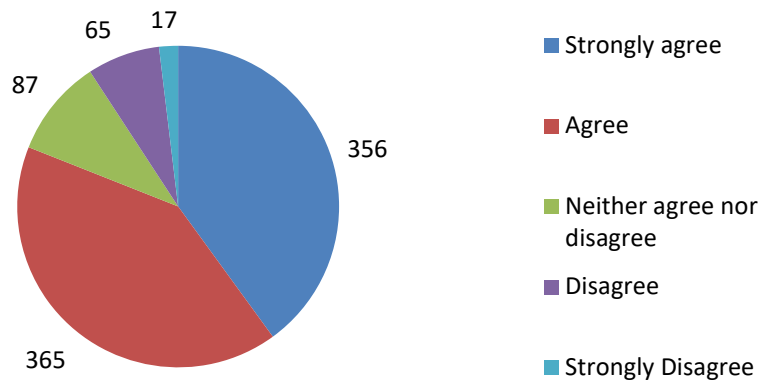

### Allied papers offered are relevant and useful



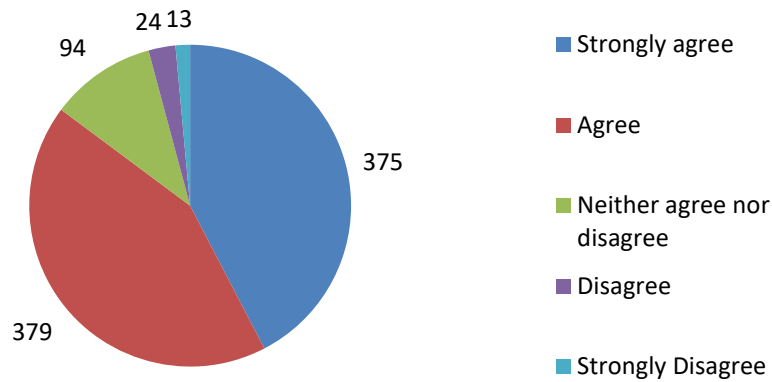

### Curriculum is useful to prepare for competitive examinations



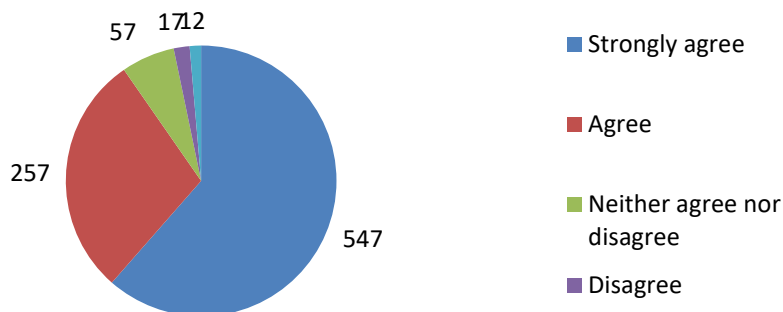

### Curriculum imparted the necessary skills



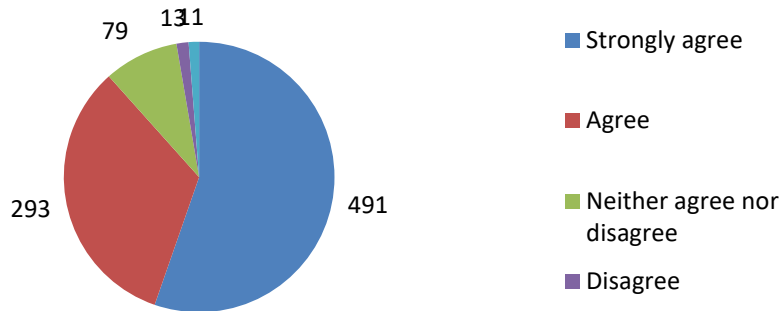

### Books related for the programme were sufficiently available in the college library



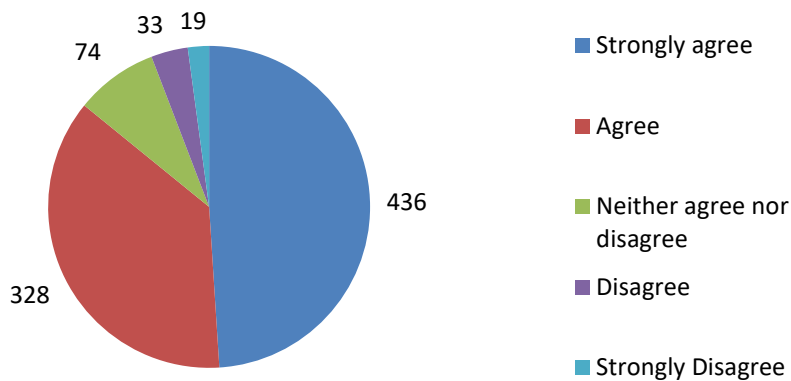

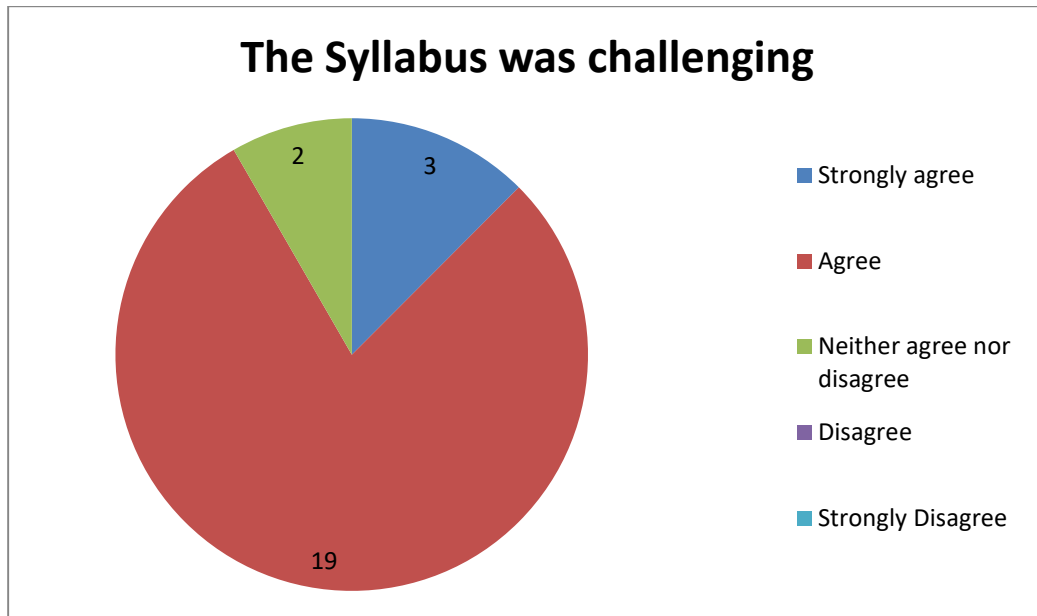
### Project in the final semester was essential (If Applicable)



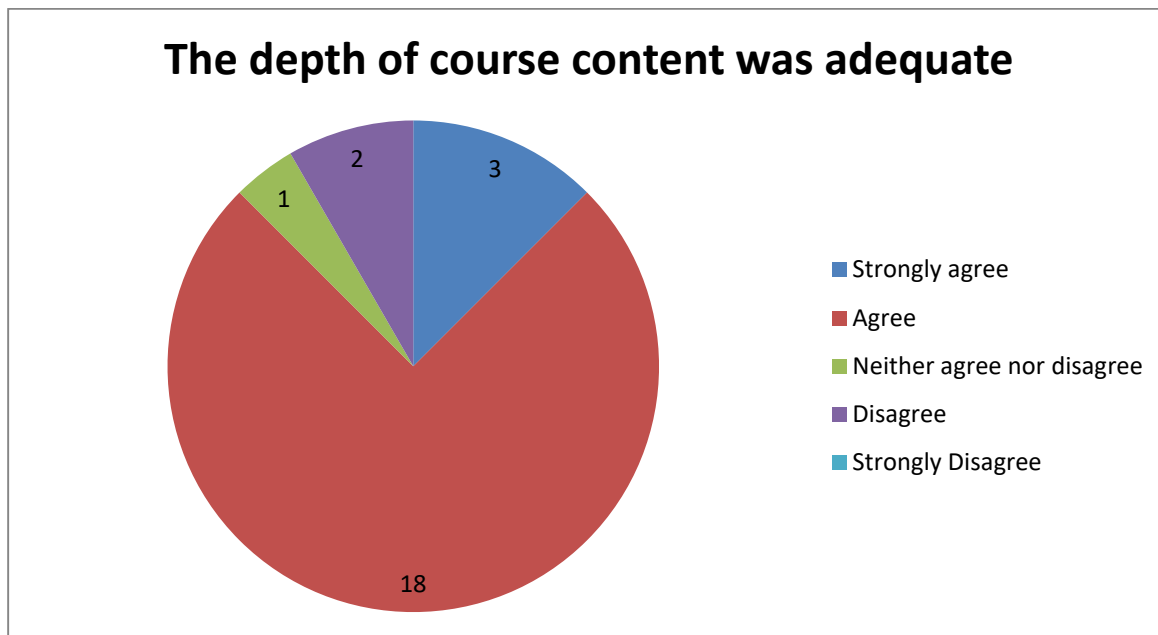

### Curriculum Feedback for PG Students



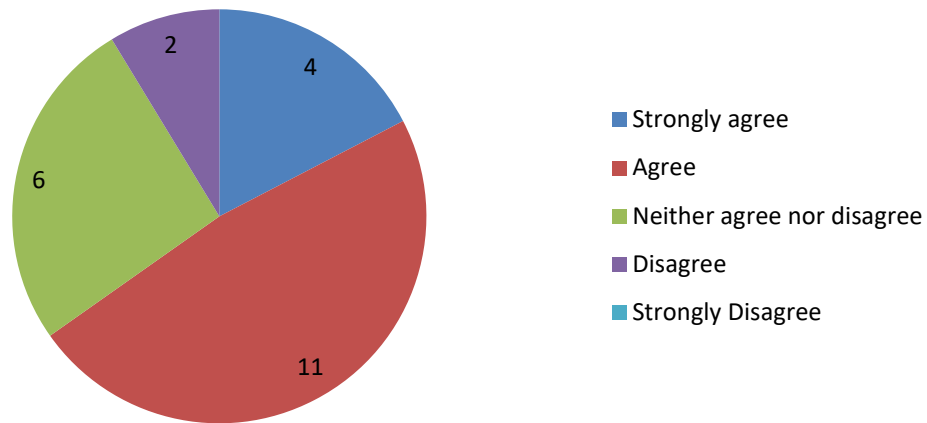
3 students among 24 students strongly agreed that the syllabus was challenging and 19 agreed to the statement. Remaining 2 students disagreed that the syllabus was challenging



3 students among 24 students strongly agreed and 18 agreed that the depth of the course content was adequate. Remaining 3 students disagreed that the depth of the course content was adequate.

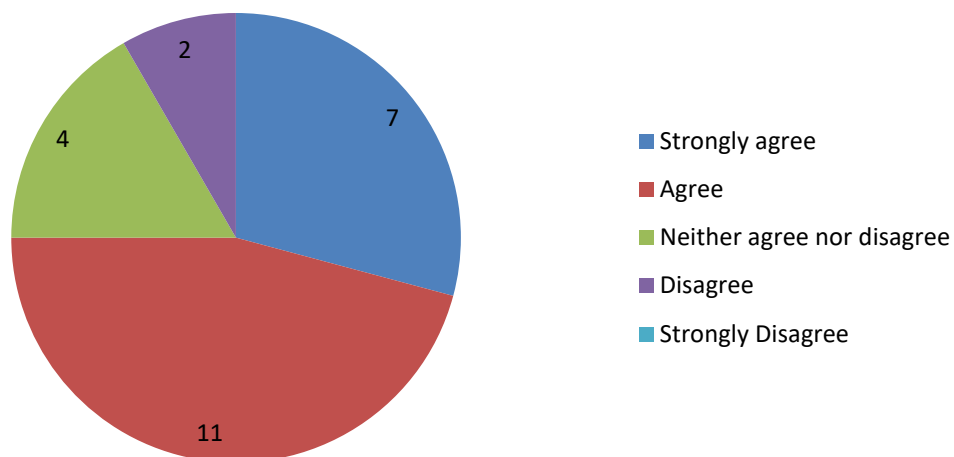


### The Syllabus was relevant to the present day need

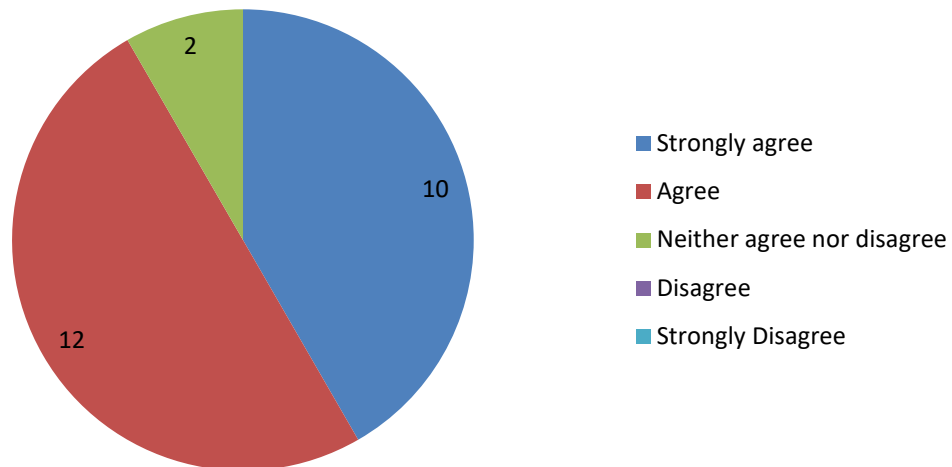
### The syllabus was helpful in attaining the programme specific outcome

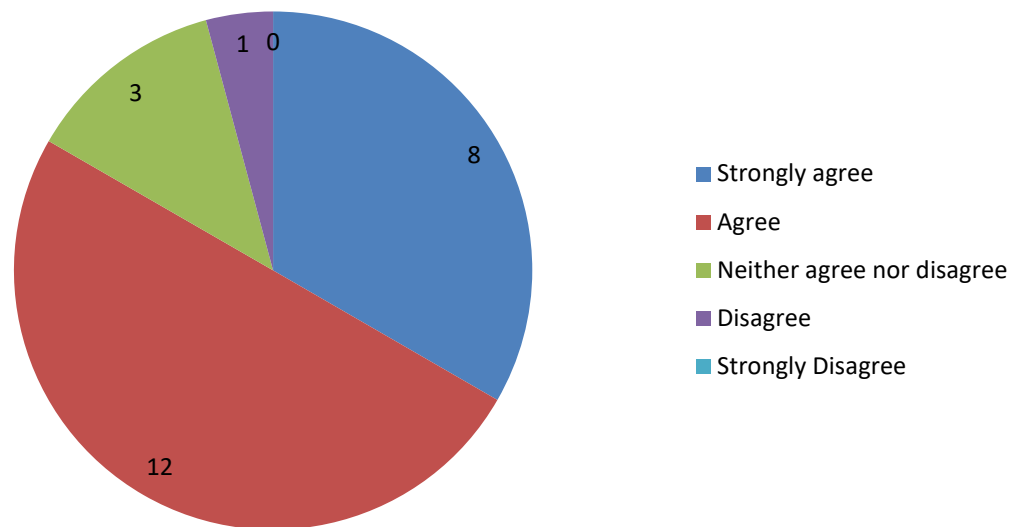


### Allied papers offered are relevant and useful

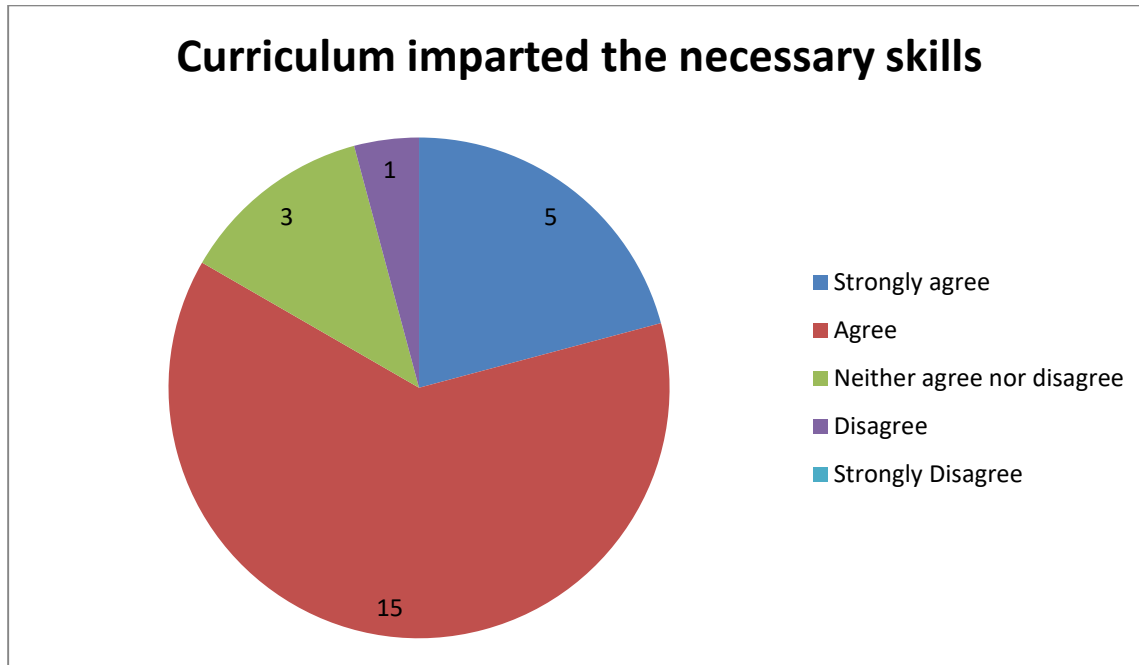
### Curriculum is useful to prepare for competitive examinations







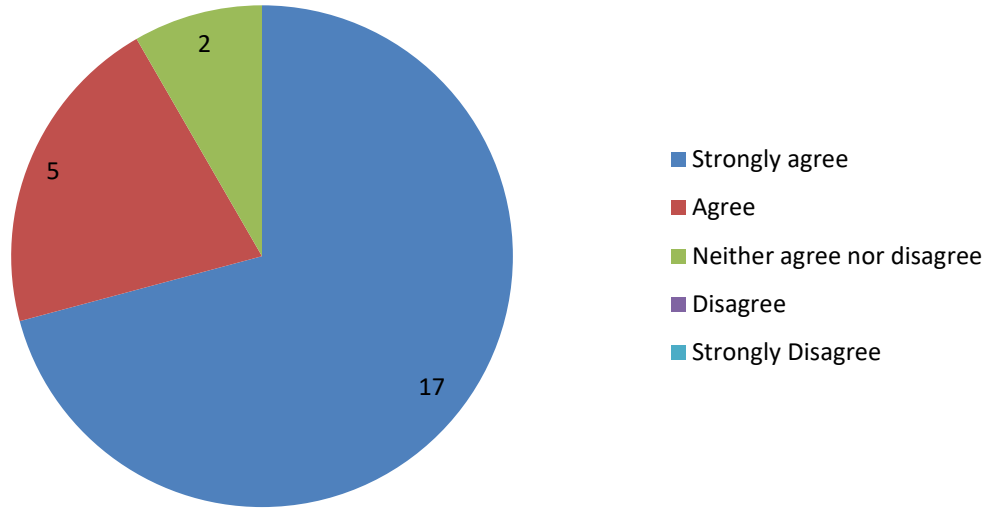

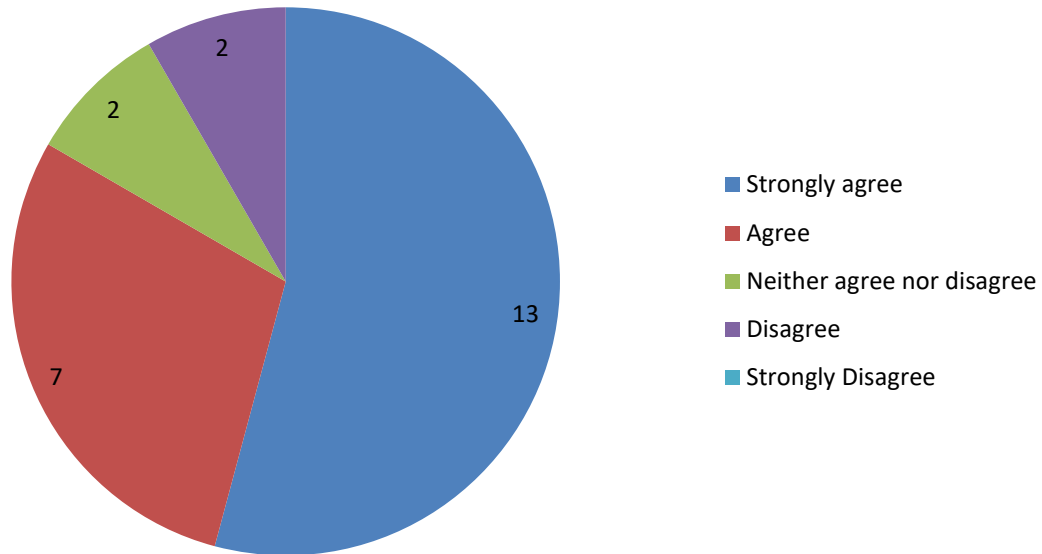
### **Books related for the programme were sufficiently available in the college library**



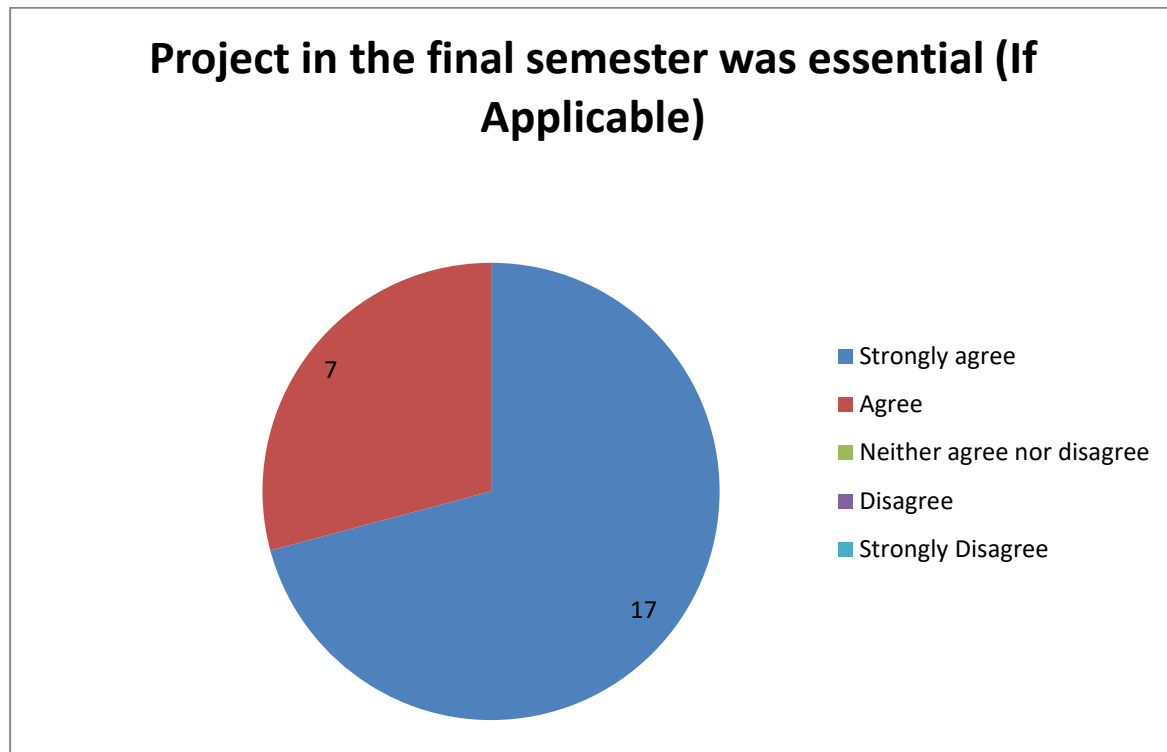
