- ❖ We have a plan to introduce bar code system for the examination.
- ❖ As a part of introducing alternative energy in the campus the management has plan to install solar energy panels for lights and fans in the Art block in the next year. The estimated cost may be around 10 lakhs.
- ❖ A solar water heater is likely to be installed in the boys hostel.
- ❖ A fully furnished Audio visual centre is to be established for telecasting education related presentations.
- ❖ As a part of green initiative the Principal plans to plant a minimum 100 trees every year. This will neutralize the possible gas emissions from our laboratory.
