



The question pattern change for the Summative Examinations from November 2021 is given below:

Exam duration reduced to **2 hours for PART I, PART II, PART III and PART IV**. The Pattern of Question paper is changed in UG – Part – I, II, III & IV as follows:

1. For Part – I, II & III

- i. The 75 external marks is divided into two categories:
 - a) 25 marks for MCQ's online test. (one hour)



- b) 50 marks for Summative Examinations. (two hours)
- ii. For Part I, II & III the pattern is changed as follows:
- It consists of two sections instead of the previous three sections.
 - The Section - A 10 multiple choice questions in the previous question paper pattern is removed.
 - In the new pattern Section A consists of five either or choice questions
(5 X 4 marks = 20 marks)
 - In the new pattern Section B consists of five open choice questions out of which the student has to answer three questions **(3 X 10 marks = 30 marks)**
 - In both Sections, it is mandatory to ask one question in each unit.
2. For Part – **IV External Question Paper Pattern**
- In Part IV question paper (new pattern) Section A consists of seven questions, the student has to answer any five questions. **(5 X 6 marks = 30 marks)**
 - Section B consists of five questions out of which the student has to answer three questions. **(3 X 15 marks = 45 marks)**

For PG Private Candidates (for whom external mark is 75) the question paper pattern has Section A & Section B as per the current pattern, except that the Section B questions carries 15 marks instead of 10 marks.

A report on the Summative Examinations under the Autonomy Stream, held in the month of April 2020, submitted to the Principal.

Pre – Exam Preparations

A total number of 210 current examinations question papers & 134 arrear examinations question papers were set by 121 examiners. All the questions papers were set by teachers with not less than 6 years of teaching experience. We are happy to inform that almost all the teachers who were offered the question setting accepted gladly and completed the assignment within the time frame.

Examinations

The Summative Examinations, April 2020 (Phase I) was commenced on September 21st, 2020 and ended on September 28th, 2020 for UG sixth semester and PG fourth semester. The Summative Examinations, April 2020 (Phase II) was commenced on January 7th 2021 and ended on 1st February 2021. A total number of 3798 students of U.G, P.G, Certificate Course, PG Diploma and M. Phil Courses appeared for the examinations. During the course of examinations, a total number of 144 students (517 scripts) were absent in the 42 sessions of examinations. We regret to inform that 6 students indulged in malpractices during the examinations. The list of students indulged in malpractices are enclosed. Due to the Pandemic situation all the examinations were conducted in online mode using Googleclassrooms.

A total number of 28,209 answer scripts (UG, PG, PG DIPLOMA, CERTIFICATE & M.PHIL. PROGRAMMES) were evaluated. Answer scripts of six students, who indulged in malpractices, were not valued and their results withheld. In total



28,209 scripts out of 28,044 scripts passed the examinations. The overall pass percentage is 99.41%. 97 private students applied for the examinations and 73 students passed out.

Evaluation

A total number of 162 internal examiners were appointed to carry out the evaluation work. The Central Online Valuations of Phase I examinations was started on September 22nd, 2020 and was over on 29th September, 2020. The Central Online Valuations of Phase II examinations was started on January 18th, 2021 and was over on 2nd February, 2021. The mark entries in the scoring sheets and foil cards were verified by our teachers, which helped for effective valuation. All the central online valuations were conducted in our College MCA and MBA computer laboratories. To conduct the online examination in an efficient manner a technical support staff group and helpline staff teams were established. The technical support staff members and helpline staff members effectively handled their tasks **liaisoning** the students to undertake the examinations successfully. We sincerely thank all the staff members involved in this activity. Five students (6 scripts) applied for revaluation. 6 scripts were declared as 'No change' in the revaluation. Supplementary Examinations were conducted for the UG, PG out-going students who got 1 or 2 arrears in the final semester only. 3 Students appeared for the supplementary examinations. 3 Students cleared the papers. Totally 3 scripts were valued in this examination and 3 scripts were declared as pass.

Awards Committee Meeting was conducted on 08.02.2021 and the results were published in our College official website and also our college apps VHNSNC on 08.02.2021. The revaluation results were published on 20.02.2021. In overall, 99.41 % scripts were declared as pass. In our college, out of 922 final year UG students 887 will get their degrees [96.20%] and out of 274 final year PG students 267 will get their degrees [97.45%]. In PGDCA out of 27 students 27 will get their diploma [100.00%].

Pre – Exam Preparations

A total number of 145 current examinations question papers were set by 60 examiners. All the questions papers were set by teachers with not less than 6 years of teaching experience. We are happy to inform that almost all the teachers who were offered the question setting accepted gladly and completed the assignment within the time frame.

Examinations

The Summative Examinations, November 2020 was commenced on December 14th, 2020 and ended on December 24th, 2020 for current semester. The Special Examinations was commenced on November 18th, 2020 and ended on November 28th, 2020. A total number of 3828 students of U.G, P.G and Certificate Courses appeared for the examinations. During the course of examinations, a total number of 160 students (473 scripts) were absent in the 42



sessions of examinations. We regret to inform that 15 students indulged in malpractices during the examinations. The lists of students indulged in malpractices are enclosed. Due to the Pandemic situation all the examinations were conducted in online mode using Google classrooms.

A total number of 23781 answer scripts (UG, PG, CERTIFICATE COURSES) were evaluated. Answer scripts of 15 students, who indulged in malpractices, were not valued and their results withheld. In total 23781 scripts out of 23,611 scripts passed the examinations. The overall pass percentage is 99.29%. 54 private students applied for the examinations and 36 students passed out.

Evaluation

A total number of 206 internal examiners were appointed to carry out the evaluation work. The Central Online Valuations of Summative Examinations November 2020 was started on December 15th, 2020 and was over on 26th December, 2020. The Central Online Valuations of Special examinations was started on November 18th, 2020 and was over on 28th November, 2020. All the central online valuations were conducted in our College MCA and MBA computer laboratories. A report on the Summative Examinations under the Autonomy Stream, held in the month of April 2021, submitted to the Principal.

Pre – Exam Preparations

A total number of 123 current exam question papers & 130 arrear exam question papers were set by 80 examiners. All the questions papers were set by teachers with not less than 6 years of teaching experience. We are happy to inform that almost all the teachers who were offered the question setting accepted gladly and completed the assignment within the time frame.

Examinations

The Summative Examinations commenced on May 6th, 2021 to May 8th 2021(three days), and resumed from, June 15th 2021 to July 5th, 2021(18 days). A total number of 3712 students of U.G, P.G, Certificate Course, PG Diploma Courses appeared for the examinations. During the course of examinations, a total number of 70 students (203 scripts) were absent in the 42 sessions of examinations. We regret to inform that 11 students indulged in malpractices during the examinations. The list of students indulged in malpractices and the absentees list are enclosed.



A total number of 26,352 answer scripts (19,467 current exams, 244 arrear exams and 5,479 practical exams, 1,117 Part V exams, and 45 OMR scripts) were evaluated. Answer scripts of eleven students who indulged in malpractice, were not valued and their results withheld. In total 26,201 scripts out of 26,352 scripts passed the examinations. The overall pass percentage is 99.38%. 48 private students appeared for the examinations and 40 students passed out.

We are proud to place on record that we have conducted all the semester examination's theory papers using OMR (Optical Mark Recognition) statements. We have also used OMR foil cards for our practical examinations (both internal & external). The usage of OMR machine in our Controller of Examinations office was very helpful in bringing out the results in a more effective manner and in a short duration.

We place on record our sincere thanks and gratitude to a team of dedicated College staff members for rendering their assistance in the successful conduct of the examinations.

Evaluation

A total number of 181 internal examiners were appointed to carry out the evaluation work. The Central valuation was started on June 21st, 2021 and was over on 05th July, 2021 (13 days). The OMR mark entries in the answer scripts were verified by our teachers, which helped for effective valuation. In this regard, we thank them for their noble service. 6 students (6 scripts) applied for revaluation. 4 scripts were declared as pass in the revaluation. Supplementary Examinations were conducted for the UG, PG out-going students who got 1 or 2 arrears in the final semester only. 4 Students appeared for the supplementary exams. 4 Students cleared the papers. Totally 4 scripts were valued in this examination and 4 scripts were declared as pass.

Awards Committee Meeting was conducted on 14.07.2021 and the results were published in our College official website and also our college apps VHNSNC on 15.07.2021. The revaluation and supplementary results were published on 29.07.2021. In overall, 99.40 % of UG scripts, 99.65 % of PG scripts, 100 % of Certificate Course scripts, 100 % of Diploma course scripts were declared as pass. In our college, out of 1031 final year UG students 962 will get their degrees [93.31%] and out of 259 final year PG students 257 will get their degrees [99.23%].

Report on the Summative Examinations, November 2021

A report on the Summative Examinations under the Autonomy Stream, held in the month of November 2021, submitted to the Principal.

Pre – Exam Preparations

A total number of 475 questions were used in this summative examination, November 2021. Of which we have used 377 current examination question papers & 98 questions for arrear examination question papers were set by 194 examiners. We are happy to inform that almost all the teachers who were offered the question setting accepted gladly and completed the assignment within the time frame. The Question Paper setters were given a pre-structured feedback form to give their feedback on the curriculum and the subject. 194 setters have given their feedback. 611 questions were received by email as a go green initiative. Receiving of Question Papers by email improved the quality of Question Papers and also saved time.



Examinations

The Summative Examinations commenced on February 3rd, 2022 and ended on February 26th, 2022. A total number of 3708 students of U.G, P.G, Certificate Course and PG Diploma Courses appeared for the examinations. During the course of examinations, a total number of 84 students (231 scripts) were absent in the 66 sessions of the examinations. We regret to inform that 36 students indulged in malpractices during the examinations. The list of students indulged in malpractices and the absentees list are enclosed.

A total number of 24,259 answer scripts (20,407 current exams, 230 arrear exams and 2,583 practical exams, 1,039 OMR scripts) were evaluated. Answer scripts of thirty six students, who indulged in malpractices, were not valued and their results withheld. In total 23,521 scripts out of 24,259 scripts passed the examinations. The overall pass percentage is 96.96%. 36 private students applied for the examinations and 26 students passed out.

We are proud to place on record that we have conducted all the semester examination's theory papers using OMR (Optical Mark Recognition) statements. We have also used OMR foil cards for our practical examinations (both internal & external). The usage of OMR machine in our Controller of Examinations office was very helpful in bringing out the results in a more effective manner and in a short duration.

All the answer scripts were given OMR tearing on the same day of examination by a team of dedicated teachers, which enabled us to expedite the valuations. We place on record our sincere thanks and gratitude to our College staff members involved in this task.

As a first initiative in our college, we have conducted online Multiple Choice Questions in the Summative Examinations of November 2021. The MCQ examination was conducted using dedicated software purchased exclusively for this examination purpose. MCQ Examinations are conducted for UG Part I, Part II and Part III courses only. For the MCQ examination, we have made elaborate arrangements by receiving 451 numbers of questions (150 questions for each course and for each unit 30 questions). We have used 229 number of these questions in the November 2021 Summative Examinations. This MCQ examination was conducted for one hour online examination for each course from 31.12.2021 to 21.02.2022. To monitor the effective conduct of MCQ examinations a helpdesk comprising of our college staff members was established. We thank all the staffs involved in this activity.

UG theory examinations duration for all courses (except Employability Skills and Self Learning courses) were conducted for 2 hours. The question paper pattern was also changed to the 2 hour time duration.



Evaluation

A total number of 122 external examiners were appointed to carry out the evaluation work. The examiners were from Trichy, Madurai, Thirumangalam, Sivagangai, Rajapalayam, Melur, Sivakasi, Sattur, Aruppukottai and Virudhunagar. The Central Valuation was started on February 9th, 2022 and was completed on 18th February, 2022 (9 days). The OMR mark entries in the answer scripts were verified by our teachers, which helped for effective valuation. We sincerely thank their services. 34 students (44 scripts) applied for revaluation. 3 scripts were declared as pass in the revaluation. The external examiners were given a pre-structured questionnaire to get their feedback. The following are some of the important suggestions given by the examiners:

1. I am afraid to say this but it would be good to give practice on students' handwriting to the level of autonomous grade. Some students are lazy in writing which I have seen in their papers which have less pages. Otherwise, I'm always happy of your hospitality and academic excellence.
2. Online valuation is new one some students aren't attach the answer scripts clearly.
